FSSENTIAL UK SCHOOLINFO

The Department for Children, Schools and Families (DCSF) is the central governing body responsible for education in England and Wales. There are separate education departments for Scotland and Northern Ireland. Schools in England and Wales follow the National Curriculum (www.nc.uk.net). This is a programme of learning divided into Key Stages:

Foundation	Primary	Secondary
Nursery (3-4 year olds)	Key Stage 1 (5-7 year olds)	Key Stage 3 (11-14 year olds)
Reception (4-5 year olds)	Key Stage 2 (7-11 year olds)	Key Stage 4 (14-16 year olds) GCSE
		Key Stage 5 (16-18 year olds) ALevels

The Foundation Stage covers the education of children aged 3 to 5 in a range of settings. Often they are attached to a school. The Foundation Stage prepares children for learning in Key Stage 1 and is consistent with the National Curriculum.

The post 16 age group is catered for in Sixth Form and other further education colleges. This is optional and is sometimes referred to as Key Stage 5.

The academic year in the UK begins in September and follows through to the following July. There are 195 school days and these are divided into three terms, each term having a one week mid-term break:

September to December (Christmas 2 weeks) Autumn Term

Spring Term January to April (Easter 2 weeks)

Summer Term April to July (Summer holidays 6 weeks)

- Please send through an updated resume via email, starting with your most recent position. Education students planning to teach in the UK straight after completing their degree should start with their teaching pracs.
- Within your resume, list the names and contact details of at least two referees who have seen you teach within the last two years. Send scanned copies of any written references and/or teaching prac reports that you feel will support your application.
- You will need to provide scanned copies initially and then original or certified copies of the following documents:
 - your teaching qualifications
 - Canadian police check
 - your passport (photo and visa pages)
- Before you leave Canada, we recommend you register with an umbrella company to receive tax benefits in the UK. You can claim back on flights to the UK, rent and other expenses. Your REd consultant in Canada will provide details on our preferred limited company provider.


